Bylaw Revision update

As promised, the review of the CKARC Bylaws was held at the June 2011 Board Meeting. The result of the review was presented to the membership at the July 2011 meeting, and is published in the August & September issues of QSP.:

At the July 13, 2011 Board meeting of CKARC, the Constitution, Mission Statement, and Bylaws were reviewed by those present.

Items of change that were suggested to the officers, either in advance or by those present, were from the ByLaws:

Article I Section 1:

Discussed removing the Activities manager. After discussion we recommend the activities manager remain a member of the Board of Directors and an officer of the CKARC.

Article I Section 2:

Discussed the proposal that all CKARC officers be ARRL members. Discussion commented that it is hard enough to recruit and maintain officers as is. We recommend not putting any further requirements on the officers.

Article II Section 1:

Discussed the recommendation of having the club President move the November club meeting up one week, due to poor attendance the day after Thanksgiving. After discussion we recommend that the President maintain and exercise his / her current authority to set meeting dates and times. (Already stated, no change recommended.)

Article II Section 2:

Discussed the duties of the Vice President in relation to the club inventory, specifically the insurance. We recommend that the entire board maintain the responsibility to audit the inventory to be insured, and that they do so at the time the insurance renewal is presented to the board.

We, the CKARC Board of Directors, recommend that the ByLaws remain the same, with the exception of one minor change. The change will be to Article III, Section 3, pertaining to Life Membership. The current wording is listed first, and the proposed changes are listed below.

Current: Article III, Section 3: Life Member: Any Full member who has paid dues for a total of twenty five (25) consecutive years as a Full Member is excused from further payment of dues and retains all rights of Full Membership. Each Life Member **and their Spouse** are afforded complimentary admission to all Club activities. Persons eligible for Life Member status must submit an application to the Board of Directors.

New Proposal: **Article III, Section 3: Life Member: Any Full member who has paid dues for a total of twenty five (25) consecutive years as a Full Member is excused from further payment of dues and retains all rights of Full Membership. Each Life Member is afforded complimentary admission to all club activities. Persons eligible for Life Member status must submit an application to the Board of Directors, who shall make the final decision.**

The proposed changes to the CKARC Bylaws (as printed above) will be printed in the club's August and September 2011 QSP newsletter, and will be voted on at the September 2011 CKARC club meeting.

HB9DRV Sells Rights to Ham Radio Deluxe

Simon Brown, HB9DRV, has sold the rights to his popular Ham Radio Deluxe software package to a group consisting of Mike Carper, WA9PIE, Randy Gawtry, KØCBH and Rick Ruhl, W4PC. All three principals have more than 25 years of experience with radio data communications. Rick Ruhl is the president of W4PC Software, Inc whose products include the PakRatt, PKTerm and Radio Operations Center software suites. Randy Gawtry is the president of Time-wave Technology Inc whose products include the PK and DSP families of data controllers and other commercial data products. Mike Carper is an experienced Fortune 500 technology executive, educator and featured speaker in the areas of wireless technologies and IT Service Management.

“Simon has done a fantastic job with this software,” Carper said. “His vision for integrating rig control, rotor control, logging, digital modes, and satellite operations into a single integrated feature-rich software suite has captivated the ham radio community. We’d like to see this product continue in a way that respects the hard work put into this package by Simon and others, maintaining that vision, while delivering timely fixes and feature enhancements in the future, will be the number one priority.”

“After many years writing the Ham Radio Deluxe software it’s necessary to take a break and hand the whole project over to another team,” said Simon Brown, HB9DRV. “The support effort required has become more than I can realistically manage, with many thousands of users, new radios and other hardware appearing all the time and unexpected changes to the infrastructure used by Ham Radio Deluxe such as QRZ.com, I no longer have any time at all for other projects. As some of you will know, I have formed a company called SDR-RADIO.com GmbH and I am now working in the Software Defined Radio arena with RFspace. This is the technology of the future; a future I want a part of. In 2012 I plan to return to England and get back on the air, something I haven’t done much during the last 25 years.”

The new owners are in the process of building a development environment for Ham Radio Deluxe and they plan to begin by addressing some of the bugs in the existing “To Do List” for an upcoming version 5.1 release. The 5.1 release will be made available at no charge to registered users when completed.

Yaesu Donates FT DX 5000 Transceiver to W1AW

Thanks to the generosity of Yaesu, W1AW, the Hiram Percy Maxim Memorial Station, now boasts Yaesu's premier transceiver -- an FT DX 5000 and SM-5000 Station Monitor. Dennis Motschenbacher, K7BV, Executive Vice President for Yaesu's Amateur Radio Sales Division, visited ARRL Headquarters on August 26 to present the radio. ARRL Chief Executive Officer David Sumner, K1ZZ, accepted the radio on behalf of the station. Sumner also serves as W1AW trustee.

"Yaesu is thrilled to continue its long support of the ARRL by donating our new premium class FT DX 5000 transceiver," Motschenbacher said. "We understand this transceiver scored some of the best receiver performance numbers every measured during ARRL Lab product testing, so ARRL Headquarters guests will now be able to slip into one of the W1AW operating studios to get on the air and spin the knobs on one of the best of the best radios ever manufactured for the enjoyment of Amateur Radio."

W1AW Station Manager Joe Carcia, NJ1Q, thanked Yaesu for their donation of the FT DX 5000 transceiver to W1AW: "This radio is installed in Studio Three and is available for use to Amateur Radio operators visiting W1AW. The Yaesu Quadra amplifier, DMU-2000 and Yaesu SM-5000 Station Monitor are all attached and make for an excellent operating spot. The FT DX 5000 certainly complements the station."

Motschenbacher, who worked at ARRL HQ before moving to Yaesu, remarked that returning to Newington to make the presentation "was a wonderful personal experience for me. I was so happy to see many old friends inside HQ, friendships made during the four and half years I spent with ARRL before joining Yaesu. It didn't take me long to see that the staff is very busy supporting its membership and Amateur Radio as a whole!"
